Streets Alive: Basingstoke and Deane

Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council are inviting Expressions of Interest from local visual artists to deliver outdoor artworks on existing street furniture or walls across the borough wards, as part of the wider development

of the successful Streets Alive project in Basingstoke's town centre. This new phase of the project will be funded by BDBC as part of the Queen's Jubilee borough-wide celebrations. Successful artists will work with the ward councillors (and local community associations and action groups) on identifying a suitable location and item of street furniture and appropriate local theme for the artwork.

Artists may be considered for more than one artwork in more than one ward. Artists who have already been involved in the Streets Alive project are also welcome to apply. The **Your Voice 2 project** is a collaboration with the charity **Motiv8** (<u>www.motiv8.org.uk</u>) and the arts organisation **Project Caboodle** (<u>www.projectcaboodle.com</u>) which is a free flowing community of artists and makers. We have created an archive of oral recordings from young people

about what it's like to be young in today's society, as well as an oral archive of mature and elderly people about historical events taking place in Portsmouth. During the Artist Residency we aim to provide artists with a space to make new responsive work to these oral recordings and deliver workshops to young people.

Our projects are designed to bring art to wider audiences, especially within under-represented groups, and we use art and educational activities to help tackle some of society's challenges. We do this by collaborating with charities and organisations that support communities and promote inclusion. Our goals are to develop sustainable skills, and enhance cross generational connections that help bring people together. During the residency you will be required to provide 2 days of creative workshops and mentoring sessions to approx 10 young people aged between 12-19. We are looking for artists working with any medium from all backgrounds and living within a 50mile radius of Portsmouth. If you consider yourself an artist in the wider context and have a proven track record of making art then we would love to hear from you!

The artist residency is funded by **National Lottery Project Grants**, and will take place at **Art Space Portsmouth** and runs for 2 weeks between 23rd October – 21st January. **DEADLINE: 9th September 2022**

STRENGTHENING COMMUNITIES GRANT SCHEME (ROUND 2)

What is the Aim of the Scheme?

The Strengthening Communities Grant Scheme aims to enable local community and voluntary sector organisations to get funding to support them in building their capacity and achieving sustainable levels of performance.

The funding is intended to support the resilience of the sector and contribute towards the continued delivery of services that are responding to local needs and providing positive outcomes.

The scheme is not project orientated; it is aimed at enabling organisations to improve the way they regularly operate. Applications that foster collaborative working between community and voluntary sector organisations are particularly welcome.

Who Can Apply?

The Scheme is open to any not-for-profit community and voluntary sector organisation that is located, operating and delivering services in the borough of Basingstoke and Deane, except for those that are in receipt of strategic grant funding from BDBC in 2022/23.

Parish councils, town councils, and schools are also eligible to apply provided that they can demonstrate that the funding will benefit the wider community and is not being used to support normal service delivery and activities.

The Scheme is unable to fund individuals, for-profit organisations, groups that exclusively promote political or religious activities, and those with uncommitted/unrestricted funds that could be used to fund the activity.

Applications submitted to the Scheme will need to demonstrate how their details will support the resilience of their organisation.

How much Funding is Available?

Single organisations can apply for a grant of up to £10,000.

A Consortium of two or more organisations can apply for up to £15,000.

Organisations can only be involved in one application.

Funds awarded under this scheme will need to spent by the end of March 2023. Funding will be released in two phases of 50% each. Refer to the Applicants Guide for more details.

Councillor Community Grants funding

Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council's Councillor Community Grant scheme has been introduced to provide flexible funding for small-scale, local initiatives that will make a difference to people's lives and help bring communities together.

It is your opportunity to explain your ambitions to your borough councillor(s) and show how they meet both council priorities and identified local need.

Each borough councillor will have £2,000 per year to allocate in single grants of between £250 and £1,000. You cannot apply for more than £1,000 but individual councillors in the same ward may combine part of their allocations to provide a grant up to the maximum limit of £1,000. You can apply for a maximum of one grant per financial year (April to March). We would encourage applicants to speak with their nominated funding councillor before making an application to discuss whether they would support the funding in principle.

The Customer and Communities Improvement Fund (CCIF) is South Western Railway's programme to support projects that have a community benefit or address an area of social need across our network.

CCIF is intended to support small and medium-sized projects which can be completed over the course of the year. In previous rounds of funding, we have supported more than 70 projects with a value of over £6million across our network, supporting important local causes and initiatives and delivering extensive social value and benefit.

An important part of CCIF is that it involves customers and stakeholders in helping inform which schemes are taken forward. Once a final list of preferred schemes has been finalised, it is submitted to the Department for Transport (DfT) which will make the final decision on which schemes go ahead.

We are pleased to say that we are now inviting bids and proposals for our next round of CCIF. You can download a copy of our latest handbook here, which provides details on the type of projects we are looking for, the application process, and how to contact us should you have further questions about CCIF or your application.

Applications for this new round of funding can be made for projects which will be started and completed between 1 April 2023 and 31 March 2024. The closing date for bids is 23.59 on Friday 16th September 2022.
